He will share understanding as a layman of the why and how of DBS. He will also discuss his own experiences having the hardware installed, having his implanted controllers programmed to optimize their settings, and living with DBS for the past several years. This talk is for anyone interested in the amazing brain and for patients/caregivers contemplating DBS surgery.

<b>Biography: Admiral Hyman G Rickover, USN and the Naval Nuclear Propulsion Program</b>	Holloran	Thu, 8/2/18	1	10:00 AM	12:00 PM	\$5.00
Admiral Rickover served in the US Navy for almost 64 years (from June 1918 as a Midshipman at the Naval Academy until his forced retirement in February 1982). Starting in 1946 when he took a one-year course on nuclear energy at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory, the rest of his career was as the head of the Naval Nuclear Propulsion Program with assignments in the Navy and the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission and its successor agencies. Nuclear powered submarines, starting with USS NAUTILUS and nuclear powered surface ships, starting with the cruiser USS LONG BEACH and the aircraft carrier USS ENTERPRISE, were the direct result of his technical and political efforts. The nuclear power industry in the West started with the Shippingport Atomic Power Station, which was also designed, built and operated under his direction. Bob Holloran was part of the technical staff of Admiral Rickover for eight years and reported directly to the Admiral the last three years as the Naval Reactors Representative at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard in Kittery, Maine.

So, if you are looking to purchase a new digital camera or have a digital camera, but want to know more about it so you can take better photos, then this is the class to attend.
